17-Inning Tie Game

May 17, 1925

The New Orleans Pelicans and the Little Rock Travelers were deadlocked in a 2-2 tie after 17 innings when the umpires were forced to call the game on account of darkness. Both teams each used only a single pitcher for the entire contest – James Scott for the Pelicans and Rube Robinson for the Travelers. Scott issued a single walk and the Pelican defense was brilliant behind the inspired play of Buddy Myer at shortstop.
