## Turtles Slaughter Breitenstein

July 9, 1909

The *Grand Old Man* – Ted Breitenstein – was finally driven from the mound in the sixth inning after a five-run first inning and string of hit and run plays left the Pelicans with a five run deficit. He was replaced by young William Bokenfohr, often referred to as the *phenom of the city lots* in the press of the day, making hits first appearance for New Orleans. It was too little too late as the Pels dropped the game 12 – 2 to the last place Memphis Turtles.
