## **Season's Second Opening Day**

August 7, 1905

Yet another outbreak of yellow fever in New Orleans caused the city to be quarantined and forced the Pelicans to move to Meridian, Mississippi, for their game against the Little Rock Travelers. It was the first ever Southern Association baseball game played in Meridian. Nearly 1,000 brave souls braved a tremendous wind and rain storm to witness the Pelicans defeat the Travelers 8-0. Despite having to play the remainder of the season on the road, the Pelicans overcame adversity to capture their first Southern Association pennant.
