Al Milnar Wins 17 Consecutive Games

June 7 - August 21, 1935

Al Milnar was a native of Cleveland spotted by Cleveland Indians' General Manager Billy Evans and sent to the New Orleans Pelicans in 1934 for seasoning. He went 22 – 13 with a 2.61 ERA in his first season and much was expected of him in 1935. The young southpaw didn't disappoint, going 24 – 5 with a 3.85 ERA. His .828 winning percentage and 140 strikeouts led the Southern Association during the 1935 season.

However, during a remarkable 76-day period, from June 7th through August 21st, Milnar won 17 consecutive games in which he was the pitcher of record, setting a Southern Association record. Twice he was relieved when the game looked to be in jeopardy only to receive no decision as the Pelicans rallied to win the game. Equally impressive is that 13 of his 17 wins were complete game victories thrown on four day's rest.

The streak was broken on August 25^{th} against Knoxville as Milnar and the Pelicans lost 4-5 in 11 innings.
